

ICM Research interviewed a tightly controlled sample of 1001 adults aged 18+ across the UK on 10-11th October. Results have been weighted to the profile of all adults.

<b>Q1. Do you approve or disapprove of the military action by the United States and Britain against Afghanistan?</b>	
Approve	74%
Disapprove	16%
Don't know	10%

<b>Q2. Do you think that the United States and the coalition should have done more to find a diplomatic solution before attacking Afghanistan or did they do enough?</b>	
Should have done more	37%
Did enough	57%
Don't know	6%

<b>Q3. Do you think military action in Afghanistan should...?</b>	
Stop now	11%
Stop AFTER Osama Bin Laden had been handed over or killed, but BEFORE the Taliban regime has been removed	21%
Stop AFTER Osama Bin Laden had been handed over or killed, AND the Taliban regime removed	58%
Don't know	9%

<b>Q4. In your opinion should the war against terrorism be extended to Iraq?</b>
